This newsletter is dedicated to School Board member, Bill Sander, who passed away in his home at the age of 82 on the afternoon of November 25th. Bill dedicated over 30 years to our school community in so many ways; as School Board Chair and member, Negotiator for the Board Negotiating Team, member of the design team for the Community Education Center of the Green Mountain Technology and Career Center, and Committee Chair for a task force in the late

1990's that was devoted to exploring how to keep students in school by increasing student engagement. In fact, one of his greatest achievements was working to lessen the student dropout rate from almost 20% to under 5% during his leadership at that time.

Although Bill was instrumental in making positive changes to our school system and the experience of both students and staff alike, perhaps Bill's most special contribution was the gift of his heart and his time. He believed that there was something worth celebrating in every individual and was a champion, in particular, for those who struggled. Bill spent his entire life in service to others. When he settled in Vermont, Bill and his wife, Jan, ran a group boarding home for youth who needed that kind of environment to thrive, which was a continuation of the work he had done in his previous home state of Colorado. Bill took immense pride in staying in touch with past clients who thanked him for believing in them and encouraging them to make better lives for themselves. His commitment to community extended itself to all aspects of his life.

Bill's influence and support will be felt always in the corridors of our school buildings, the classrooms full of our students, the experiences of our staff, and the meetings among members of the School Board and our extended communities. We give our highest respect and affection to Bill for his many contributions to our school community and the many people he impacted every day.
